1. Legal Service

The FASS Lawyer can:

- Give you advice, information, and let you know where else you can find help for family law, family violence and child protection matters.
- Help you with urgent family violence protection matters.
- Draft court documents.
- Help you get information and evidence about family violence.
- Go to court with you.

2. Social Support Service

The FASS Social Support worker can help you:

- Before, during and after court.
- Plan for when you go to court.
- Deal with court staff and security staff.
- Find other social services you may need.

FASS does not provide ongoing legal help or counselling.
